

LET'S MAKE STORAGE EASIER



Packing

- Pack your valuables and essentials separately and plan on keeping these items with you.
- Label your boxes and, when possible, use clear plastic containers to easily see what's inside.
- If you have more than one container, make sure to note each container's serial number and the items placed in each.
- Use specialty boxes designed with dividers for crystals, china, and glassware. Label these boxes as "FRAGILE."
- To help protect your belongings, fill empty spaces in boxes with packing paper or peanuts.
- Protect your appliances and furniture by placing moving blankets between pieces to prevent scratches.
- Hang clothes on non-rusting hangers, zip tie them into groups, and pack them in garment bags — or make your own with a garbage bag.
- Save space by using dresser drawers to store smaller items.
- Leave appliance doors slightly open to prevent mildew.
- If you're storing wool items, use cedar chips or mothballs to prevent damage from moths.

Getting started

- Make sure to get any required permits, and check your homeowner association guidelines if needed.

- Use the PODS Moving & Storage Calculator. Tell us how much stuff you have, and we'll estimate the number of containers you'll need.
- Make an inventory list of everything you'll be storing in your container.
- Have your packing and loading supplies ready. This can save you time and help protect your belongings.
- Review your Rental Agreement for a list of prohibited items so you're aware of what can't go in your container.
