SRP is proud to support the diverse communities where we live and work. In 2025, we gave more than \$5.2 million to over 300 nonprofit organizations across the state.

MEETING BASIC NEEDS

We are honored to partner with organizations that make a meaningful impact by providing essential services, including food banks, shelters, and youth and workforce development programs.

One of our partnerships is with Valley of the Sun United Way, a nonprofit celebrating 100 years of helping Arizonans most in need through collaborative efforts focused on housing and homelessness, education, workforce development and health. In 2025, SRP employees took part in 20 microvolunteer events with Valley of the Sun United Way.

This partnership removes financial barriers and allows our entire community to experience and enjoy the arts.

Empowering future leaders

SRP's support of community leadership programs, including the Hispanic Leadership Institute, African American Leadership Institute, Asian Corporate & Entrepreneur Leaders and programs offered by various cities, helps identify and develop future community leaders with diverse backgrounds and offers team members continued opportunities for growth.

Education Resources

Along with our partners, we support the leaders of tomorrow and future employees by investing in their education in the areas of STEM, safety and the environment.

PREPARING OUR FUTURE WORKFORCE

- SRP contributes more than \$2.4 million annually to education programs throughout Arizona, impacting more than 250,000 students.
- Last year, SRP provided \$400,000 in direct classroom funding for teachers through various grant programs and partnerships.
- Over the past year, 21 professional development workshops were offered with more than 700 educators participating.

Community Events

SRP strives to cultivate a workforce that reflects our communities. We attend and host over 780 community events each year in support of our customers and community partners.

SRP partners with Fiesta Sports Foundation each year to build playgrounds for communities in need. In 2026, volunteers from SRP and Fiesta Sports Foundation built a playground at Boys & Girls Club of the Gila River Indian Community (Komatke Branch) in Laveen Village, Arizona.



Community Safety

SRP's safety campaign helps keep families and children safe around water and electricity by providing vital information online, at community events and through workshops.

INCREASING COMMUNITY SAFETY IN 2025

- **80,000** safety materials distributed, including **535** life jackets
- **30,000** swim lessons provided to community pools each summer for free or at reduced rates
- **25** pool fences donated and installed at community pools in the Valley in 2025
- **272** professionals trained on power line work safety through SRP's annual Electrical Safety Workshop
- **\$500,000+** granted to nonprofits that provide heat relief services such as cooling and hydration centers, unhoused population outreach and HVAC replacement

Spotlighting Excellence

FRIENDS OF THE VERDE RIVER, FIESTA DE LA GARZA 2025, BEST PARTNER OF THE YEAR AWARD

This award recognizes SRP's steadfast dedication and continued support for River Friendly Living projects and stewardship events — efforts that have a lasting impact on the Verde River and its communities.

ASU FOUNDATION SPARKS SUCCESS AWARD

This award recognizes the impact SRP has had on the ASU community and beyond through partnerships with Educational Outreach and Student Services focused on workforce development and K-12 education.

VITALANT IMPACT AWARD

This award is given to less than 10% of all blood drive coordinators for providing the largest impact on the blood supply by going above and beyond with outstanding blood drive planning, as well as recruiting donors on difficult days or during times of the year when the need is most critical.

JAPANESE FRIENDSHIP GARDEN KAKEHASHI AWARD

This award honors SRP for its longstanding partnership and meaningful support of the Japanese Friendship Garden. Through sponsorship opportunities, art displays at its headquarters and educational presentations for employees, SRP has strengthened the connection between culture and community and inspired understanding, engagement and lasting community impact.
