SRP's expansive network of canals includes over 131 miles of canal banks and 80-plus miles of multiuse trails that are perfect for walking, jogging, biking, fishing and scenic exploration. Keep the following tips in mind to stay safe and make the most of your time by the water:

- Don't drive motorized vehicles, including electric bikes and scooters, on the canal banks.
- Camping and fires are prohibited near canals.
- Swimming, canoeing, kayaking, water skiing and tubing are not allowed in the canals.

Save water with everyday habits



The average Valley resident uses 120 gallons of water a day, but small changes at home can make a big impact. Start by turning off the faucet while brushing, running only full loads of laundry or dishes, and keeping showers under 10 minutes. Check for leaks, especially around toilets, which can waste large amounts of water. Outdoors, where most water use occurs, inspect sprinklers and irrigation systems often and consider low-water-use landscaping. Together, we can conserve more.
