New year irrigation tips

Here are a few best practices to follow:

- **Inspect for leaks:** Check all parts of the system for signs of leakage and address any problems promptly.
- **Maintain berms:** Ensure berms are in good condition to prevent erosion and guide water effectively.
- **Remove obstructions:** Keep ditches and gates clear of debris to maintain proper water flow.
- **Check valves:** Test valves for proper operation and replace any that are malfunctioning.
