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What is an IWDD?

An Irrigation Water Delivery District (IWDD) is a county special taxing district that provides an easy way to collect funds for maintenance and repairs for your neighborhood flood irrigation system.

Benefits of an IWDD

- Establishes an account with the Maricopa County Treasury to save for current and future irrigation expenses
- Creates an equitable way to share the cost to repair and maintain private irrigation systems
- Eliminates the task of collecting funds door to door
- Establishes fair and transparent rules for how funds are spent
- Ensures a well-maintained private irrigation system, which allows irrigation to flow efficiently, protecting our water resource

SRP's role in establishing an IWDD

SRP aims to ensure the longevity of your neighborhood private irrigation system. The SRP Assisted Irrigation Delivery District (AIDD) program helps homeowners form an IWDD by guiding you through the entire formation process and providing continued support once complete.

How SRP can help

- Organize and attend neighborhood meetings.
- Help in identifying the entire private irrigation system for the neighborhood.
- Provide answers to questions on topics such as neighborhood history and irrigation.
- Work directly with city, town and county officials during the formation process.
- Help complete and submit required applications and documents.

An IWDD works for you

When challenges arise, your IWDD trustees are there to support the delivery of flood irrigation. Your IWDD trustees coordinate the maintenance and repairs of the private irrigation system. IWDD trustees with SRP to provide support to new and existing homeowners, including system education.

Cost

IWDDs provide fair cost distribution, and funds are 100% dedicated to your IWDD. Costs are determined by your IWDD annual budget, which is divided by the number of acres within your IWDD. Costs are conveniently funded through Maricopa County property assessments.

In 2022, the annual average cost for an IWDD homeowner with a 0.25-acre property was \$61.01.
